

HEALTH SYSTEM

- Eligibility criteria for permanent residents and Canadian citizens in the public health system vary from province to province. Each territory then has its own health plan. Managed by the Canada Health Act, the public health system can be supplemented by paid services at private institutions.
- Public hospitals provide basic care only, including: prevention and treatment of common injuries and illnesses, basic emergency services, primary mental health care, palliative and end-of-life care, and health promotion, primary maternity care ...). The private sector cannot in any case support these services.
- Emergency services in public hospitals are also free for people who do not have a government health card. This card must be presented before any medical procedure.
- To cover the care provided by specialized institutions, you must subscribe to private insurance.

VACCINES

To get to Canada, no vaccine is required except yellow fever. Travelers from an infected country over the age of one year must present a vaccination certificate.

Between essential and circumstantial vaccines, we recommend the following vaccines :

- Viral Hepatitis B
- Diphtheria Tetanus
- Poliomyelitis
- Typhoid

Specific vaccines for children can be made after medical consultation. Only the doctor can judge the effectiveness of updating the French vaccination calendar.

SICKNESS

The performance of the Canadian health care system is well established. This is reflected in the level of satisfaction of Canadians. According to the annual survey on the quality of care, and in response to the question "Do Canadians receive quality services? The results were more than favorable, with a rate of 57% for the public sector, 72% for doctors, 76% for pharmacists and 91% for managers.

Health risks in Canada are, on the other hand, very minimal. But, it is still recommended to take the necessary precautions If you are traveling in swampy areas, take the necessary measures to protect yourself against the fever of West Nile, a disease transmitted by infected mosquito bites, between May and October

THE DISADVANTAGES OF THE PUBLIC **SYSTEM**

- Overloading of public hospitals and emergency services
- Waiting times are very long
- Lack of professionals, which makes it difficult to find a general practitioner or to have an appointment in good time

THE DISADVANTAGES OF THE PRIVATE **SYSTEM**

The care provided in private hospitals is very expensive. Subscription to a complementary mutual insurance is essential to be reimbursed.
