

HEALTH SYSTEM

In Japan, life expectancy is one of the longest in the world! Their secret? While Japanese people often have an exemplary diet, they also have a state-of-the-art health care system. All the country's cities have many quality health facilities and the staff is highly qualified.

If there is a negative point about the health system in Japan, it is the high cost of care. It was impossible to go to Japan without taking out international insurance. Also, if you plan to settle in Japan, it is important to sign up for National Health Insurance in order to enjoy the same benefits as a Japanese citizen. This insurance covers 70% of the care (80% for the students only).

The steps to register for the AMN are very easy and are done at the town hall closest to your place of residence.

VACCINES

No vaccine is required to enter Japanese territory. However, it is recommended by the Pastor Institute to have all your vaccines up to date and to inquire about the following vaccines if you are going for an extended stay in rural areas:

- Hepatitis B
- Typhoid
- Japanese encephalitis

SICKNESS

There is no particular pandemic in Japan. However, we want to reassure you about the Fukushima nuclear accident in 2011. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), the risks to health are very low. We do not recommend you to venture there!
